The phenomenon of Philellinism in Europe, the US and other countries, during the period of the Greek revolution of 1821 is usually associated with the intimate and intense involvement of Lord Byron, who also died in Greece in the process. However this was only part of this multifaceted, multinational and complex movement to support internationally the Greek revolution. The movement encompassed not only the politically motivated but also those attracted by the romantic aspects of the movement as well as those who saw an opportunity for employment as well as for financial gain. One unexplored aspect of the support for the Greek movement came from women, both individually and collectively, in the form of associations which raised money through theatrical performances, fund-raising dinners and balls, as well as auctions and bazaars of the most varied products from china sets all the way to «Greek» liqueurs and even candies !

The presented **Hrysa Kakatsaki** graduated from the Archeological-History Department of the Philosophy School of Athens, followed by postgraduate studies in Italy. She has worked for the National Gallery, in public education, publishing and translation.
